

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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LB 770

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body. This is my priority bill. I care passionately about it, because I think \$900 is a lot of money to a lot of the people in my district. But I am going to support the bracket motion, because I don't think this body is really serious about going forward with this bill, and I see no point in wasting time in these waning days of the session in spending hours on discussion. So I think that when it's time for people to get serious about this bill...and perhaps next year is the time...we can bring it back to the agenda. But at this point, I will support the bracket motion.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Chambers on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this my close?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Do you want it to be your close?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: It is your close.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I will not take any more time. Either you feel that this bill ought to advance when we're not going to do anything with it, or it ought to sit here. If you advance it, it has priority status, and I presume there may be some point at which it will come up on Select File; I don't know. But since there is not a serious intent about the bill, I offered the motion. That's all that I will have to say. Thank you, Mr. President. But I'll ask for a call of the house, and I will take a machine vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.
