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with...with the whole area of Community Justice and why that was a part of what was done in terms of the development of the new prison, and I think it's particular appropriate for us to focus on it, at least for those of us who are from Douglas County, to focus on it today because Douglas County Board spent a great deal of time talking about the construction of the new correctional facility in Douglas County today. It is going to be a substantial expenditure of money, just as our construction of our new prison is a substantial expenditure of money. The other day when I had the amendment about the McCook Work Camp, there was a lot of talk about going back on what we had committed to. I think that this is just as much of a commitment. We have committed to the counties who have gone about in good faith developing very comprehensive plans for what they're going to do in the area of Community Justice, which is going to keep people out of...keep the most appropriate people out of our correctional facility, both the state facility and the county facility. When we are talking about the most appropriate level of services, this is a level of services that we absolutely have to have in place. It is something we've committed to. We have a number of counties that have developed these comprehensive plans. In Douglas County, they have traditional options including day reporting, alternative...alternative sentencing and drug courts, and a driving during suspension diversion program. These are the kinds of things that we can do that will keep individuals within their own communities, keep individuals out of incarceration and that's another thing that I guess I would say that...that Senator Pedersen talks about it only being available after incarceration. There are a lot of pieces of Community Justice that have to do with...with finding those individuals that are most appropriately dealt with in other kinds of services and other kinds of justice programs and much less expensive programs, and that's the other piece that we have to talk about. And so I strongly believe that we have to go forward with the money that was clearly appropriated and a number of us that were a part of the very difficult decision about spending the kinds of dollars that we spend on the new prison, really, part of it for us was knowing that the other side of it is that we were going forward with some other alternatives that were going to be less expensive and one of my concerns, as I expressed the other day, in terms of the work camp is that it turned out not to be as cost effective as we had
