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I am certified as a substance abuse program. Let's say, for a minute, I'm not a senator. I put in a grant for this money saying I will be able...be glad to give services to the offenders at such and such a rate, and they give me the grant money. I'll tell you what it will be for me and for people like me. At this point it will be extra money because we are already giving them services, people. When somebody goes to the probation office and needs a service, they're sent usually to a service that they can either afford themselves or else they're sent to a service where they have a sliding scale. And the places...this is a double-whammy, people, if they go to a place that has a sliding scale that means that particular service is already getting money from the Health and Human Services Department through the Mental Health Divisions. Yet, we want to put \$500,000 into a program that we're going to give them more money and more grants. I'm not saying we don't need money in this field, we do. But are we going to shove it through one department, then come next two years and see? We may want to, down the road, move Probation under Corrections. The reason we have this hang-up in this state is our state has Probation under the justice system, under the judges. There are seven other states or eight other states that have that...have that here. Eight other states have Probation under jud...quite a few states have Probation under Corrections. If Probation was under Corrections it would be a natural and they'd just go ahead with it and that's what they would be doing. But I see it, at this point, as being a competition. It is, outside of a few little programs that the Probation is not giving now which it's trying to beef-up and do, they're doing everything except that one thing that they want to do that they haven't been able to do because of money and staff is what we call day reporting. That's the only thing Corrections brought up in the committee hearing.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** One minute.

**SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN:** I am saying that in committee we had two bills. They both deal with the same thing. We all support Community Justice, but do we support two Community Justice programs? We've got \$500,000 pending here, people, and the next amendment that comes up is my amendment to take that money and put it back in the General Fund. The people right now are being
