SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, I don't want to belabor. A call of the house. I don't know I even need a call of the house, the way the board looks. Call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Motion before the body is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.
