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anybody when there's no money...nothing in statute that says it should be. I hope that that is not taken in a way that I was saying it in any other way. I don't...if they promised money, they promised money without having money (laugh) and I don't know how that can be done without having the statutory authority to hand money out. And I know that the people that I...in Douglas County understood that if that money was not there that they wouldn't get it, and that's what they were telling them. (inaudible). With that, I'll return my time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Peder...let me ask Senator Wehrbein a question on this one.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, Senator Wehrbein, included in this handout that you gave was a list of communities with various programs.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Where are...are any of those programs in Douglas County?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many...where are the bulk of them, would you say?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the ones that I have here are programs for "postincarceration" and transitional living. One the city of Omaha has, driving during suspension diversion program.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I meant around the state. Are most...are most of the programs that are in the process of being developed located in Douglas County...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No.
