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me that it was in the budget, and we will support what the budget says. And I know that that is probably the same thing that we will hear from the Appropriations Committee. And I just want to tell you that I thought it was a complete waste of money, when we already have this facility, basically, probably all it needs is some work. We've got a very good training facility out in Grand Island; we're adding onto that. The Highway Patrol is going to move out there. Maybe they can do that. One of the things that was made (sic) to me, well, isn't that a long way to drive? Well, people have been driving back and forth through them distances for a long time. The training facility we now have in Lincoln, that Corrections has, they'll have to drive from Tecumseh up here to use it; they'll have to drive from Omaha, Hastings, York to use them. Corrections does have guns, they've got rifles in the towers, and I've already told Senator Bruning that they have used them. They need the training; I'm not saying that they don't need a place to train, I'm saying they've got one, so why are we spending this money? With that, I would answer any questions you might have. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I guess, I rise in support of Senator Pedersen's amendment. I have to agree, I think, unless my memory is slipping again, I think there's probably four training facilities in the state, or more. I'm not sure what is in Omaha, but I think there's probably two here in Lincoln, there is two in Grand Island, there's one out at the ordinance plant in Grand Island that the State Patrol uses, and there's also one at the training center in Grand Island. And I guess I agree with Senator Pedersen that they may have to drive a little ways. Maybe the people at Hastings, Kearney, wherever they happen to be, use one at Hastings, the ones at Tecumseh can come up here and use it here. But \$950,000 is a awful lot of money for a shooting range, I believe. I'm not going to talk on this very long, but I just believe that we do have the adequate facilities in Nebraska right now, and this would be a good place to save close to a million dollars. Thank you, and I'll yield my time back to the Chair.
