SENATOR SCHMITT: To my knowledge there's four of them now that law enforcement use, the one that corrections uses, here in Lincoln, the one out at the Air Park that the Lincoln Police Department, I think, shares with the department, and the Patrol has used that.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR SCHMITT: And there are two at Grand Island, one at the training center, one at the ordinance plant.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Now, would they be able to train at those sites with the same types of weapons that the prison guards would have to...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...be trained with?

SENATOR SCHMITT: I believe the training academy at Grand Island probably is basically just shotgun and handguns there. But they do use the high-powered rifles at the one at the ordinance plant.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Now, would the...do the prison guards, are they trained in automatic and semi-automatic weapons there, to your knowledge?

SENATOR SCHMITT: I don't know, but I would guess they would be.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum. So you, in your opinion then, the facilities that we have in place now, right now, could possibly handle this, or there would probably be a little more traveling time, though, for them to train, is that right?

SENATOR SCHMITT: That, plus we may have to upgrade them a little bit. I think we may have to spend some money to improve them, but...
