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SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. I don't...I'm going to listen to the rest of the debate on this. I don't know exactly how I'm going to vote on this, but I certainly think that right at a million dollars is an awful lot of money, and if we have facilities in place that we could use. I'll listen to the arguments on both sides. Thank you very much for your time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I...some of the things I wanted to speak to were addressed by Senator Wehrbein, but there are a couple things I think that need to be brought into this focus. First of all, I don't think there's a question about whether they're going to build a new range. They're going to have to. I think where it's located is inadequate and they cannot continue to use it there, so they're going to build a range somewhere. Now whether they build it in Tecumseh or not is not important in my mind. And people think that I'm speaking because it really doesn't make any difference. The only thing is they do have the ground down there. Because they have a couple hundred acres of ground, they have the place to put it, which means they don't have to buy land, plus the fact it's away from the city far enough that I don't think growth is ever going to become a problem, which it could around any major metropolitan area. I think the other thing that I wanted to address that we need to recognize, years ago when we built buildings we didn't put any elevators, we didn't put all the safety features that we put in that we have to use today because federal law, in some instances, makes it and just good common sense in other instances makes it. We have to build them, certainly, with the most safety. Now whether \$950,000 is the right number I have no idea. I'm not an expert in building gun ranges, but I will tell you that it's certainly something that we want to make sure is safe. We want to make sure it has the adequate ability to train these people. I understand that this range would have about 12...12 ranges on it, so that a goodly number of people who are in the law enforcement could train on it the same time. And, as Senator Wehrbein indicated, it has a night facility, so some night training could be carried on there. And, as I said, there are a number of things that add to the cost of this thing. I can't tell you, as I'm sure that
