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\$950,000 is right. But I will tell you this, if you have got...I forget the number that Senator Vrtiska said, about how many different ranges they have there, we have a number of ranges that I just enumerated. We can't use all of them at one time. Now let me go...that's just about the physical facility alone. Now let me go to something on training. In the first place, and I think Senator Schmitt, if he's around, will agree with me on this, a good many people in law enforcement are not, repeat, not gun oriented. They are more service oriented, mechanically, whatever you want to call it, but they...they don't necessarily have an affinity to firearms. Now it used to be said that it took five years to make a good shot. I don't think that's...I never thought that was true. I think two years if you do it every week. Something like this is necessary and, like I say, if you say that magic word "rifle" you start increasing your costs substantially. If you start using fully automatic weapons, it depends a lot on the type of fully automatic weapons you use. If you're using submachine, what is referred to as submachine guns, which are normally pistol calibers, 9 millimeter, .45 ACP, 40 S&Ws, that type a thing, you have lesser costs than if you go to light machine guns which are normally small rifle cartridges, like the 762 by 39 Russian...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: ...or the 223. All of this costs money and if you are going to train safely you cannot train large numbers all at one time. And to train well with weapons you must spend substantial time with your weapons. This is not a playground that we're talking about. If you want an environmentally solid, safe range, you are going to spend a lot of money, and I would say that your number on a properly designed range is going to be a lot closer to \$950,000 than it would be to \$450,000. I am going to vote against the Pedersen amendment because I think if they're going to have a shooting range, and if you've got guns you better train with them, I think it's going to be absolutely that they have a facility out there. If other people...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR TYSON: ...can use it, well and good, but I urge you to vote against this amendment. Thank you.
