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coordinate services, to coordinate the things that they are doing in providing services. What coordination is going on statewide so that these firing ranges, wherever they may be needed, we have one in Omaha, we have one in Lincoln, we've got two in Grand Island that we've heard about, now we're looking at Tecumseh, what is being done for all of the law enforcement agencies. And I don't question the need for these firing ranges and I don't question the need that some of the components are more expensive to put in these firing ranges than others. But where are we replicating services? Where are things obsolete? Who's coordinating all of this? Who's looking into what's done and what's done where, or is the Legislature just being asked to kind of piecemeal this whole thing? In my discussions with Senator Hilgert, he, as a former First Infantry Division person, and I, having been in the First Infantry Division myself, both knew that even in the army, which, as he rightfully pointed out, is certainly not a model of efficiency and spending of taxpayer money, even they only have one sharpshooter range, as I understand it still, for the country. Why is it that we have so many ranges and...and maybe we need them, I don't know the answer to that, I'm not an expert. But where is the coordination statewide? What's the agency looking at this? Who is raising these questions beyond what we have the expertise to do here in the Legislature? And, Senator Wehrbein, I don't even know if you have the answers to this, but I think this is something that the Appropriations Committee should certainly be looking at and we should be coordinating, a kind of...and that's the big picture for me. The side issue is, if we're looking at long firearms, rifles, in a prison, maybe we need rifles that have high-velocity capability, but it seems to me that in a prison we're looking at, perhaps, shotguns. It seems that we should perhaps have training with handguns. Even in the turrets outside of the prison are we going to be having people with the kind of high-velocity rifles that would go off into the countryside and off into the community just...even though they have training, shooting that kind of caliber weapon? I mean I don't know the answers to these questions, but it seems that we should have somebody in the state looking into this as a state policy rather than what we're attempting to do as a Legislature, not knowing those answers, not knowing that information. Who is overseeing all of this for all of our law enforcement, all of our prison and correction facility folks? I think Senator
