persons under 21 and purchasers of kegs of beer, you have to have warnings for those. A book that we're not...haven't even brought into the picture yet is a book listing purchasers of kegs. We have another book on that and we have to attach a certificate to the kegs, more paperwork, but...and that's oftentimes a violation. Somebody has a keg with no sticker on it and they come back to the retailer and that's obviously a violation. Some of the other things we are...can be cited for a violation are...and then our license...our permit to sell is suspended is a sale to an intoxicated person. That's sometimes a rather hard, hard judgment to make. Some people can walk in, in a pretty straight line, and actually be legally intoxicated and then you get caught for that. Another one is selling after hours and so on, et cetera. There's all sorts of things that you can be cited for violations other than selling to a minor, which is going to be catching these retailers. Incompetence, there's also a section in the law that I had forgotten about, minors and incompetence, and then anybody who's an attorney in here knows how hard it is to determine competency on folks, and I don't know that that's been used but it's something that is in there. So you can also be cited for a violation if you sell to an incompetent person, whatever...however that's judged. The book does...I need to reiterate what the statute says now. Every holder of...dealing with the...what they call the identification register, and you have to maintain this register...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...on your counter. You can't have it in a drawer. It's got to be laying out on the counter where everybody can see it. We've trained our clerks to hold the driver's license back and it's rather ironic that these underage people come in and try to buy and you're holding their driver's license. They may have set a six-pack of beer down and the money even on the counter, and you check their ID and they panic and all they do is grab their ID, so you do end up with the beer and the money out of the deal. But it's very, very hard to get law enforcement up there. You cannot keep that minor in the store. You get into a physical altercation with the clerk and
