the Beutler AM1645 deals with the department having an engineering evaluation or assessment performed by an engineer and he has taken out the fact that an existing livestock waste facility has violated, but I don't know whether he's addressed the future or not with this language. I'm concerned that we...the best analogy that I can make is that sometimes there are surgeries that may be routine--a tonsillectomy, an appendectomy--and that could be equated to a small hog units, small class I farm. So if we have an appendicitis, we'll just have a nurse come in or an aid come in and do the appendectomy and if there's problems we'll call in the doctor, but only if there's problems. You should see what happens when we say that advance practice nurses will do something that come close to what medical doctors think are in their purview of expertise. And even though the Natural Resources Committee received a letter from the Board of Engineers, it was very nebulous. They're just tired of fighting with all the interested people in dealing with waste. And I...I just want you to know that there are some board members who are very uncomfortable about allowing nonprofessionals to make a lagoon for waste without the help of an expert. I know people are thinking, ah, well, what does she know; her husband's on the board so everybody can just ignore what she has to say. Maybe that would be your attitude. I know that's the attitude in the lobby. However, the only thing the board worries about is the safety and health of the citizens of Nebraska...
