SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I wonder if I could ask Senator Beutler a question or two, if he would yield to questions.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Of course.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Beutler, in AM1312 on page 15, lines 23 through 25, as I understand, the amendment would strike those lines and those lines say, "A permit may not be revoked solely for an unintentional discharge that occurs at another facility owned or operated by the same permittee." Is it...is this your desire to strike these lines? And, if so, I would like to engage in a little discussion on the rationale.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, it is my desire.

SENATOR BROMM: (Laugh)

SENATOR BEUTLER: Are you going to make me doubt my desire?

SENATOR BROMM: I'm going to make you...I'm going to ask you if you could...

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Laugh) All right.

SENATOR BROMM: ...explain that for me, please.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Basically, Senator, if you look back through the existing criteria, it indicates that an applicant is unsuited or unqualified to perform the obligations of a permit holder, and I'm reading at the bottom of page 14, if the applicant, manager, et cetera, et cetera, has been, and then
