Bohlke, you wish to close? Senator Bohlke waives closing. All those in favor of the Bohlke amendment to LB 594 vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bohlke's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Bohlke amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment, Senator Dierks, I have AM1366, but I have a note you want to withdraw, Senator?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Next amendment, Mr. President, Senator Jensen, AM1475, but I have a note you want to withdraw this, Senator, as well.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next amendment when you're ready.

CLERK: Next amendment, Mr. President, Senator Jensen, AM1490.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen.

CLERK: And you want to withdraw this one, Senator, and substitute...

SENATOR JENSEN: AM1603.

CLERK: ...AM1603. Yes, sir, I have that.

SENATOR JENSEN: All right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Seeing no objections, it is done. Senator Jensen, to open on your amendment. (AM1603, Legislative Journal page 1821.)

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. AM1603 adds clean-up provisions relating to the practice of pharmacy. Actually, there was a bill, LB 797, concerning pharmacy that was around 350 pages long, that did come before
