that I know of...that I'm aware of at this point in time. Even with our General Funds, of course, every year, every two years we appropriate the money, and so every two years we have an opportunity to review the agency, what are they doing with the money, what did you spend it for, and we have that kind of review. And that kind of review also pertains to the cash funds, to those things that come in from fees and the other kinds of revenues that are generated, that are not General Funds, but we review the cash funds. Now we don't review those as closely as we review the General Funds, but, nonetheless, the information and the Fiscal Office and the operative aspect of the Legislature that deals with the review of ongoing appropriations does have the opportunity to make that kind of review. And even to the extent that fines are sent to a local school district, I suppose the elected officials there, as we, as elected officials here, would make a review of the expenditures of those monies. So here or there, almost everywhere in also everything we have some kind of review of expenditures. And so, as a general...the general wisdom of the matter would seem to me to be sure that all money is sent through some kind of review process by elected officials, if you intend to have the best kind of control on those funds. And I don't think there are very many situations where we want some agencies spending large amounts of money that are not periodically reviewed. Having said that, I would like to ask Senator Bromm, if I could, a question or two, because it's unclear to me...it's unclear to me exactly how...how we should address this, I guess is my question. And the question, Senator Bromm, you mentioned the federal law and the fact that perhaps federal law doesn't authorize the return of these funds from the federal court system to our schools in accordance with our statute, but my question goes to the front end of the process. In...in seizures in which our state or local law enforcement officials are involved, what authority do they have or what option do they have with respect to whether they go through the federal court or the state court as far as the seizure, as far as the court validation of the seizure action is concerned? In other words, maybe we need Senator Chambers' amendment or maybe we need a different kind of amendment that says you don't send the money through the federal court to start with; you send...
