first part to say let's find out how they're utilizing the money and where it's going, and that I would...I would think would be a wise amendment no matter what. But I...the point that I want to make is that we have federal law and we have state law and when the two generally clash, generally we have a supremacy clause with respect to the federal law. Now, in this case, where we have a...a different procedure under federal law for seizure of drug assets, and bear in mind that a lot of drug wars are won and lost on the federal level because we, as a state, are at the tail end of the drug chain, the drug war, as it applies on a federal level, starts beyond our borders and continues all the way down to Wahoo, Nebraska, and the federal government gets involved at...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...at any stage of that process. I hear the scolding that's going on. Let there be scolding. Let there be an examination of the facts. Let there be an examination of the law that's on the books and the federal law that's on the books, and let us come back on a day when we have more information and more understanding. I don't sense a lot of understanding on this floor about this matter, other than Senator Chambers and Senator Brashear and there may be others, but I don't sense a high level of understanding of the ramifications of what we're doing. And, as a rule of thumb, I would submit to you that if you have some uncertainty or feel you need to learn more, you should not support division two of this amendment because you are...I think I know what you're going to....
