Cash Fund. We have a fund and I am getting some information on that. A lot of that comes through the illegal drug tax that we enacted, the marijuana and legal (sic) drug tax. It consists of receipts collected through the state of Nebraska, marijuana and illegal drug tax program. But I've just been informed from the Fiscal Analysts, I'm going to get more information, there's also federal court transfers into this fund. I didn't write it down. It's 216 thou...oh, '94-95 was \$215,000; '95-96, \$117,000; '96-97, \$229,000. So I...I think this is a partial explanation of what we are doing here. This, again, is only the State Patrol. Whether that is all of the federal drug money that comes into the state goes to this fund, I'm not sure. I just wanted to say that there is something here, I can't give you the whole explanation, but this fund we do monitor. I remember specifically two or three years ago we did spend quite a bit of time, in particular, on this fund as to what their requests for spending that money for. I remember we did vests and so forth and so on over...I can't remember all those details, but there is a mechanism here that we do have for the State Patrol. Once again, I do not know whether they run all of their federal drug money through this, but at least there's been transfers in, in addition to the state tax that we have. So that's just kind of an explanation of where we're at. I think there's more information needs to be known. I originally punched my light because I wanted to ask, I don't know whether it's Senator Brashear, but Senator Chambers, if he would...maybe can answer a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So I'm clear on the...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...mechanism of this. I'm always interested in the mechanism. Is it your understanding or...that a typical drug case comes in, come in off the interstate at...I'm going to say city "XXX" in central Nebraska, those prosecutors can make that decision if they're going to charge state prosecution or use federal law for prosecution, and that essentially determines where that fine money will eventually go? Is that how the decision is initially made, would you say?
