crafted, it doesn't really tie into what we're talking about. His language says: "No state law enforcement agency shall utilize the procedures for forfeiture instituted by the federal government. That is not appropriate language. Senator Brashear and I had worked on the language that we have in this amendment. Senator Bromm has made it clear he wants to kill the amendment and he's going to do everything he can to do that, so let him do as I have done. Then, when time comes to take a vote, we'll see what we vote on. But to vote on something that he's offering that has nothing to do with the issue is an attempt to get away from what we're really talking about. Senator Tyson was approaching it and I don't believe Senator Bromm has read the statutes on this situation, but I'm going to let him show that I'm wrong. Senator Bromm, have you read the statutes that establish the County Drug Law Enforcement and Education Fund Board? Have you? I see you've got the material I gave you. Had you...had you read it?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Chambers, I did read it quickly, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, once each year this board is supposed to give an accounting of all expenditures from this fund, so the accounting is required under law right now. But do you know why it's not done? Because the money's not going into that fund. It's going to the individual law enforcement agencies. So the Legislature's already enacted detailed statutes and I handed them out to you. I don't know why I waste my time, but I do. I handed them out. And Senator Bromm talked about the federal government paying for the informants. Well, in Section 28-1439.04, these are the uses that the money that goes into that drug fund that I mentioned to you can be made of the money: salaries for informants and any expenses of all agents and informants, that's from that drug fund where this money is supposed to go, that's state money; flash money for drug purchases; also money for drug purchases. If the constitution was being complied with and these statutes, when that money comes back into the hands of these law enforcement agencies, 50 percent of that goes to the schools. And which schools will it go to? You identify the counties from which the money originated just as you do with every other kind of fine and it
