says: "No state law enforcement agency shall utilize the procedures for forfeiture instituted by the federal government." That is so vague. That should not be in the statutes at all. He has acknowledged that he wants to do what I've done on other bills. That's try to defeat it by any means necessary. Well, I'm willing to stay here with him and I'll debate these issues and we'll compile a record. Then he can make it clear to people who are following what we're doing why he thinks law enforcement people should be above the constitution. Read the language of the constitution. It's clear. And then look at what these law enforcement agencies are doing. Why didn't the U.S. Attorney, instead of sending Senator Bromm to joust with windmills, why didn't he tell him, Senator Bromm, we will file a lawsuit immediately to challenge that law if it gets enacted? Because he doesn't want it enacted. They would not challenge it. And Senator Bromm is using the tactic of saying, well, Chambers, it should be...the burden should be on him to file a lawsuit to uphold...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the constitution. No, I'm a member of this Legislature. I try to persuade my colleagues. If I'm less than persuasive, then they continue to circumvent the constitution. I handed you all an editorial from the World-Herald that pointed out how inappropriate this conduct is that is going on and that for this to be possible something is wrong. For law enforcement to do this and get away with it, something is wrong. Whose job is it to right the wrong? We are the ones who have that job, and I'm in opposition to Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Beutler, you are next in line to speak. Waives off. Senator Redfield.
