potential loss of cigarette tax revenue. My bill says General Funds will make up that dollars because, remember, we have commitments to those that I named to you: the Nebraska Outdoor Recreation Fund; Health and Human Services Finance and Support Cash Fund; the City of Omaha Public Events Facilities Fund, and Building Renewal Allocation Fund, probably the most important of all. We've got commitments to those and so this is, in my own bill, has some General Fund implication assuming cigarette tax revenue drops. Now, Senator Thompson's amendment lays out potentially the \$11.7 million, plus, if cigarette tax revenue drops that could go up, let's say, to \$12 million because there's going to be a potential loss in those 3 cents also that is not calculated on your pink sheet. That's what I wanted to make clear and why I'm increasingly opposing both of these amendments, because Hilgert holds...does not raise cigarette taxes but it...it does transfer money, which makes it a direct General Fund expenditure. But I think we need a little more plan for the Juvenile Services: what kind of a building are we getting; what kind of a plan is there; what kind of a master plan; how does this fit in, the whole big picture. I think maybe Senator Thompson's established the need for it, but I'm not satisfied at this point spending \$12 million for the solution. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I call the question on the Hilgert amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Debate has ceased and Senator...oh, it has not ceased. I'm sorry. We are debating the Hilgert amendment. Senator Wickersham, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you very much. I didn't know whether I was going to get to talk or not. But, Madam President,
