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members of the body, what is being proposed here all sound...so far this has been kind of quiet and seemingly innocuous, and I don't think it's that at all. We're talking about spending a significant amount of money and, in fact, I think it's just a little bit larger than what Senator Hilgert is indicating. And if you look at your status sheet you will see that if we adopt Senator Hilgert's amendment that all of a sudden we will not be in the black. We will be in the red. Now the implications of that may not seem very great to you because we've submitted budgets and we've submitted appropriations bills in combination before to the Governor and they were in the red, but in that instance the Governor always vetoes and...because they have to and because the Legislature hasn't been responsible in restraining itself. I have been remarking to some of my colleagues about what a good job I thought we were doing this year by almost, almost presenting to the Governor a budget and a set of A bills that were more than balanced, that we were going to be able to show the citizenry of the state of Nebraska that we could adopt proposals that were within our limits, that we had the internal fortitude and discipline to do that, but I'm afraid that if we do what Senator Hilgert proposes we will not be able to do that and that when the Governor vetoes proposals, because he will have to veto proposals to balance the budget, you may not like that result. I don't know where those vetoes are going to fall, but they would have to fall somewhere and, again, you might not like it. I also think that it would be a very good goal for this body to set to present a balanced budget and set of A bills to the Governor, which we could do at the moment. Again, I believe that would send an appropriate message to the people of the state of Nebraska that we can be responsible and we can restrain ourselves and we can make our proposed spending fit within our means. Now that is not to suggest to you that I think that we should have three-cent increase in the cigarette tax if we just...if we defeat Senator Hilgert's amendment, because I'm not sure that I agree with that proposal either. In fact, I have some concerns about what Senator Thompson is proposing that we do. I, as I said before when we were debating an earlier bill, I understand that the juvenile correction system is not what we would want it to be and that it will undoubtedly take additional resources. But I am unclear, quite frankly, why we would need to spend additional money for another facility in Omaha when we built a very
