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Geneva. I don't remember if it's broad enough to include this. So what I'm willing to do today is go back, take a look at that. I do feel it would be better to commit the funds and let the executive branch carry this forward, but I will look at that language and if it doesn't contain broad enough language to include planning to get the initial work done on this facility I'll bring back an amendment on General...on Select File to clarify that. And, with that, I've talked with Senator Hilgert and we are going to pull our amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Hilgert, did you wish to pull your amendment?

SENATOR HILGERT: I do, indeed, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. And, Senator Thompson, you wish to pull your amendment.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes, I do, and I appreciate the time that we had here. I think it's important that this is on the agenda. I would be much more comfortable knowing that we've gone forward on it this year, but I respect the wishes of the body. We'll be making sure that this is planned for as part of the facility master plan for the juvenile facilities. If it doesn't contain that language, I'll be back with that language and appreciate the time and thank Senator Wehrbein for the time. This is a critical need. The problem only gets worse with time. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Now we are back to the main bill and, Senator Wickersham, you had your light on. Did you wish to speak on the bill?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I will, for purposes of clarification. Senator Hilgert, I did not mean in any fashion to suggest that your amendment was irresponsible. I don't think it was irresponsible. I think it represented a policy choice for us. But I do think it was important that the members understand the implications of that choice and that was the reason I spoke. Oh, and Senator Thompson would like a minute, and I will yield a minute to her.
