SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: We did just check the information and my legislative aide has told me that it does say juvenile services system, so that will cover it and we'll be back with more information as that plan is developed. Thank you very much for your time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. Senator Chambers, you're recognized.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I may not have made it clear when we were discussing this facility the last time, but I thought I've said over and over and over that I don't want to see another prison and if anything comes in that smacks of a prison I'm going to oppose it. I didn't want to make those remarks while they were discussing the cigarette tax and whether or not they could get that money. But now that that's off the table and they're talking about a plan of some kind, I just want my seatmate to know, because I don't think I made it clear last time, that I'm not going to support another juvenile prison. That first one, to my way of thinking, should not have been built. I opposed it and lost. I will not watch another one built and I will not watch plans drawn up for that purpose and then have to fight to try to undo it again. So I don't know what will wind up being presented to us, but I want the record to be as clear as I can make it today that any prison, anything that smacks of a prison, I'm going to oppose. Now I'd like to get on a subject that Senator Wickersham reopened, and I have to ask Senator Hilgert a question, if I may.

SENATOR HILGERT: Shoot, yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Bang! Bang! I follow instructions. No, but, Senator Hilgert, you said if somebody asks what did you do during this 90-day session you don't want to say that you voted for a tax increase or something like that.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yeah, I meant that regarding taxes. Taxes was
