further lights on. Would you wish to close on your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Madam President. As I said, that was the main part. There were technical parts to the bill that touch on issues, instead of prohibiting programs and information requests not authorized by the constitution, programs, activities or functions are authorized, if authorized by the constitution of the Coordinating Commission for postsecondary education. The requirement for the commission to submit reports to the Legislature and the Governor is amended by moving the date from October 1st to December 1st, and by adding new private colleges to the report. The requirement to take into consideration the needs of the state in a comprehensive plan is clarified. And a clarification is added to the requirements of the commission to establish criteria for review, monitoring and approving programs. The criteria for adequacy of resources and program reviews is limited to proposed new programs. Those are the technical areas that the amendment to the amendment addresses. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. The question is the adoption of the AM1317, the Bohlke amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Bohlke's amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The Bohlke amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Bohlke, I now have AM1655 in front of me. (AM1655, Legislative Journal page 1893.)
