Senator Bohlke said, there is a divisiveness there between the people that are being regulated and the regulators, and I think that's just bound to happen. SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 816.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. LB 816 is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 127, a bill by Senator Schellpeper. (Read title.) Bill was introduced in January, referred to General Affairs, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Senator Janssen, to open on your bill, please.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. LB 127 would change the way funds are raised for the
