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there's going to be...would be a provision in that for not. But I think this is something we ought to reflect on very seriously about the possibility of doing, because...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I was under the impression that there was at least a few other states that have this form, takes two votes, and maybe I'm wrong on that, but I know...in fact, that's where I...I think I heard...first heard of the idea, understanding that some other states already have it. And I could be wrong. But because we have the one-house system, it probably doesn't hurt to have our constitution reflect another safeguard in it just for that reason. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I want to blunder in here and ask a few questions, and I was going to ask Senator Kristensen, but I think maybe Senator Schimek is capable of answering this question. And you brought the issue up my freshman session, I believe 1992, my second year here, the issue of the constitutional amendment on personal property taxes. There was some urgency to get that on the ballot, and there was a lot of gnashing of teeth and were we going to get 40 votes to put it on the primary election. Is this going to impede a process like that, and is it such an impediment that it's something we need to worry about?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, Senator Schrock, that was my question to Senator Kristensen and he is...he is back now and perhaps he would like to answer it, but we didn't really finish our little discussion of that issue and one of my off-the-mike comments to Senator Kristensen was that, you know, there are maybe circumstances even now when you'd have to go to a special election. I don't...I don't think it would change those circumstances that, you know, that that might possibly happen some time, but I think that would be a rarity. And I would like Senator Christian (sic) to have...Kristensen to have the chance to respond to your question.
