amendment. Then we came back in special session and so it was, what, August or September before we got that...because, remember, we were at the end of a...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Um-hum.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...of a session. And actually I think what we did is it didn't...it took us until then to get that statute passed. But if it's a true...I mean I was looking through the Blue Book. That was the other issue, is how many true constitutional crises have you had in the last 50 years? There really hasn't been.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And, of course, this wouldn't affect a statutory issue that was placed on the ballot, and I remember LB 662, back in the days when Governor Kerrey was Governor and that passed and there was an uprising of the people who remembers the Class I's and it was put on the ballot. An issue like that, of course, is not a constitutional issue, so that would only take one vote, is that correct?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's correct and it wouldn't affect referendums for removing.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. I'm going to tend to support...I will vote for the passage of LR 18CA, because I do think that the issue Senator Kristensen raises is an area of concern of mine. And what happened this fall was a big concern. And perhaps, if we hadn't had enough time, Initiative 413 may have passed, I don't know, and I think it would have caused a lot of trouble.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't have much time left, but what I have left I'd give to Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Cudaback, you have 51...50 seconds.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess it takes me longer to get my motor started, so I better...I better wait on that. Thank you.
