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this as a very serious idea and one that is very worthy of our attention, and I hope that you will consider it seriously as well.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Cudaback, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President, members, this is a serious matter and so I don't want to make light of it in any manner. I think it was something we should think about it and I think everybody on this floor should talk about it, and I appreciate Senator Quandahl's input. In committee we talked about it extensively, and it's good. What's more important on this floor right now than our constitution? I can't think of anything. I just think it's an issue that what are we scared of here? What are we afraid of? Somebody once said fear and fear...all we have to fear is fear, something like that, what (inaudible) how that saying goes, but what do we have to fear here? What are we afraid of? We afraid that people might change their mind? Holy cow. You afraid that people might change their mind and not vote for it the next time? I think that'd be great. I think we do things on the spur of the moment. We'll say, darn it, why'd I do that? Have you ever done that? I have and I'll admit it. We say there's no checks or balances in here, and that word "check or balance" is a great...that's a great phrase whoever thought it up. We need checks and balances here. And, in this body alone, think about it, we have a public hearing. Committees don't always vote things up, do they? Don't they vote things down sometimes, IPP them? We come on General File, does everything get passed? Does everything get passed? No. How about on Select File? No. How about Final Reading? Most of the times, yes, but there's a balance there. How about the Governor, does he have a check there? (inaudible) check, maybe he'll get it out for (inaudible). I didn't mean to say that, but we do need checks and balances. We have them here. We have five right there. He can veto it. It comes back here. We have another check there. Remember the other day, as late as, what, three or four days ago, Senator Bohlke, we had an issue here before us? Some of us changed our mind in about five minutes. There's all kind of scurrying around here. Senator Chambers brought it up to us and said, what, all your rural people. I remember what you said, Senator Chambers. I remember word for
