which is the constitution. It should not be subject to popularity contests or popularity polls, although it is. The constitution and any other activity in a society such as this one is for sale. Everything's got a price tag, everything, not everybody. Senator Redfield asked me earlier about a matter related to a provision in the constitution which I wish were not there, but when the oath is taken, Senator Redfield, we're not allowed to make it conditional. Those who've had Jesuit training, where they can split a hair between the north and the northwest side and still have space to do some more splitting, talk about mental reservations where you articulate one thing in words but you have another thought in your mind so that the words do not mean completely what they would suggest to a person who is unaware that you are reserving something and not meaning everything that those words would suggest. When we take the oath to uphold the constitution, it's the whole thing. When a proposition makes it to the ballot, no matter whether the people who supported it or opposed it feel that a mistake has been made, there can be no amending. It's take it the way it is or leave it. Sometimes people get a very heady feeling about a certain notion and they act on it. We might even do that here, but, as Senator Cudaback pointed out, in five minutes we can change and undo whatever it is that we have done, and it may not take that long, but we can do it. When it comes to the constitution, it's not like that. So I don't see anything wrong with saying go ahead and move as rapidly as you want to but, before it is given the status and dignity that a provision that is a part of the constitution should enjoy, we're going to say let everybody stop, take a deep breath, turn around three times and jump over the broom and look at it again, and take awhile to think it through. I'm sure Senator Smith has had many people advise him, since he's a young bachelor, to not be swayed by that first rush or flush he will feel when he looks at a beautiful young lady and she winks because she might have had something in her eye. Be cool and don't look like a rambunctious puppy and just let things settle in, and if it's meant for you that's the way it's going to be. So if, in personal relationships, it's wise to be a bit cautious, there certainly is no argument...
