And each person, each one of us has a different reason, perhaps, but a lot of it's public service. So if you run for the city council or the county commissioners or supervisors or Legislature, especially in a small state like Nebraska, public service is the name of the game. You may have an agenda that you think is important that you want to work on when you're in that group, but most of...if you're thinking of making money, forget it; you aren't going to. And Nebraska is a very open state, especially here in Legislature. I was interested to see that Common Cause came in for both of these constitutional amendments, and I understood that better after I heard Senator Kristensen say that the...in the commission in particular, you couldn't be on the commission and then run for Legislature right away after you raised the salary, and also that no legislators could be on the commission. I think that's very important. I haven't...I'm going to read clear through, and I guess eventually you'd come back and implement this anyway, but I do hope, unlike another commission that we remember, that it would at least mention that some women ought to be on it. Right, DiAnna? Anyway, I'd...my point that I was trying to make is that the public, and I think Senator Coordsen and some others have said that, the public as a whole for some reason views the Legislature with some disdain. But most people realize that we do spend long days and that we try to do the right thing. I see my people every day, because I go home. I...not all of you get to go home every day like I do. But I see people, and they are very nice...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...and courteous and thank me for spending the long day and inquiring about bills and inquiring about something that they're interested in. So from that point of view, it's a...it's an experience that I think each one of us who takes part in it enjoys it and accepts the fact that whatever the salary is, that isn't the primary reason you run. That's what I want to make important...the important point I want to make. But I do think that we should get these two on the ballot again. It has been ten years, and I think that the public and the voters need to look at it again. And this gives them an opportunity to change the constitution one way or the other so that the compensation could be raised in some way. I notice
