Legislature. To say that I was proud is an understatement this morning. I heard some points that I'd not considered, and they came from a wide variety of people. And when I go out and give the rubber-chicken speeches, and I find myself doing more of those, and I look like I give more of them, I try never to miss the opportunity to tell them how proud I am of people who serve here. And it's been universally true for the last 11 years. The faces and names change and, sure, people vote and make me angry, and the next day I forget it because they're my ally on the very next thing, and they really do a great job that day of voting. But by and large, this Legislature does very, very good work. And given the right information, they make the right decisions. Now, it may take me a few years to figure out why it was the right decision, but they do do those things. The ability for people to stand up and talk about compensating other people who are going to serve in their place in future years is really, really a very, very good thing. You know, statistically, the average is, look around, in the next six years you're not going to see the same faces in this Legislature. They're all going to be gone and somebody new will be sitting in each one of these seats in six years. And if you want new people to come in who look pretty good when they get their picture in the front page of the paper, or if you want other people to come in who have a job that doesn't allow them to be here for six months a year, because that's what the job is, and quite frankly, how many of you just serve six months a year? Most of you are off doing forums and are going to meetings in your district, taking constituent complaints all year round. You probably work at least three to four days a week during the off season. More and more people have come to expect more and more of state government, and most of your time is spent saying, no, I'm sorry, we can't do everything for everybody. But it takes your time to do that. And so I'm proud of the debate this morning, and I...it reaffirms my belief that there is a very good group of people who are serving here. I would hope that you would move this on to Select File. We can talk about the next alternative, and that is a salary raise. And that's...I don't want to take a lot of time this morning, but I do want to take some time to talk to you about the practical realities of putting both of these on, and how might we consider best giving that message to the voters to make a decision on what to pay senators.
