SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senators Kristensen and Coordsen. Those wishing to speak to the committee amendments are Senator Coordsen...did you wish to...Senator Bromm and Senator Kristensen and Senator Schimek. Senator Bromm, for what...

SENATOR BROMM: Mr...

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BROMM: ...Mr. President, I rise for point of personal privilege, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're granted such.

SENATOR BROMM: I would like to advise the members of the Legislature that there's an effort going on, led by Excel Corporation that has a packing plant in my district, and Cargill, to arrange a food truck convoy to Oklahoma City to help with the disaster down there. Excel is donating \$5,000 of food per plant, and it's being...the convoy is being planned for Sunday. At this point, other cities who have committed to participate are Grand Island, Schuyler, Columbus, and Fremont. It would be possible, if any cities wanted to participate and help or donate food, to do so by contacting, and I'll send a memo to your offices, Ernest Pence, who is the president of Excel at Schuyler, 352-8272. And so I just wanted the body to know about it. I think it's a worthy effort, and if we can help, we should do so. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: (Visitors introduced.) Those wishing to speak are Senator Bromm, on the committee amendments. Senator Bromm waives. Senator Kristensen, did you?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Bromm, thank you for that point of personal privilege.
