Hilgert. I guess, what I would like to request the body to do then is to reconsider the vote to remove the terminology changing that "personal watercraft" to "motorboat", and with the understanding then that we will try to come to some work before the bill comes to Select File. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Peterson. Those wishing to speak on the reconsider motion are Senator Bromm, Coordsen, Schmitt, and Bohlke. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm going to support Senator Chris Peterson's motion to reconsider. I was also called out of the Chamber to meet a group of con...of people from my district and missed the amendment. I was in Natural Resources Committee when we did this work; in fact, last year I was on Transportation Committee when we did this work, and so I got to work on it in both committees, same bill, somehow. But in any event, if this is going to be considered, I would rather see it offered on Select File. We didn't even have this amendment in the Journal, we had no notice, and I'm not prepared to take the consequences that I think it will have in many of the lakes in my district. And I don't even know how many lakes it might impact. But I'm not prepared to support this. It's...it's one of those lack of notice, quick things that we sometimes do and don't realize the impact. And I appreciate Senator Peterson catching it, and I appreciate Senator Hilgert's willingness to reconsider this amendment. It can be offered again, with more debate and notice, on Select File. So I would urge the body to reconsider AM1686.
