PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, I'm going to be brief. I had my light punched and then Senator Brown fairly well answered my questions or, at least, an explanation on this part of the amendment. So I am going to take it amendment by amendment, try to understand what I'm doing each time. I am going to be supporting this amendment as I understand her explanation, and that's all I'll have at this time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. On FA202 to the committee amendments to LB 105, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Brown, let me explore the...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...when such persons are not otherwise qualified, or need such assistance to become qualified, to borrow from private financial institutions. The language "or economically self-sufficient", what is that intended to...
