SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm trying to...I'm a little bit confused about new versus I thought about any projects would be new. But is this, the plan, is this if an expansion, is that new? I don't even understand why we're distinguishing between new and established or whatever the opposite of new would be here. Would you explain that just a little bit.
