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or disapproval?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Brown?

SENATOR BROWN: Not...I don't believe that it is. I believe that the three-year plan or the five-year plan, whatever kind of plan you're talking about is a strategic plan and that has to do with...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh.

SENATOR BROWN: ...where you're going. Whereas, the plan that you're talking about approval of is new development.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: That is an immediate kind of a plan. It is something that you're actually ready to do, and that's the only thing that I believe that a...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BROWN: ...we already have a hearing process. We already have the submission of these plans, of the federal plans, to the local subdivision. And so what they need to have approval of is what you're actually going to be doing and that's what under my amendment they have approval.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right, thank you. If I understand, I don't know whether we have it in these amendments or not, but I do believe we ought to have local government approval of these plans. I can understand the strategic plan not needing approval, but I'm confused now as to what really this amendment says or doesn't say and so I'm going to have to react accordingly. I think there ought to be a plan or approval of a plan that's specific for an expansion or whatever.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Strategic plan, no, I don't think so. Thanks.
