SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as I have said, the distinction in my amendment from the committee amendments is the distinction between whether you are requiring the public housing authority to have a separate distinct plan that is developed on a different time line than the plans that they must develop for the federal government, the strategic plans. As to the plans for development itself, for development itself for specific action that will be taken, we are reverting to current law in terms of what the process should be. And this amendment has to do with efficiency. It has to do with the making sure that we are not requiring something of a public housing authority that is just, as was referenced, make-work. And with that, I would urge the adoption of this amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. The question before the body is, shall part two of the Brown amendment be adopted to the committee amendments of LB 105, that's FA201? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on part two of the Brown amendment to the committee amendments. Have you all voted? We are voting on part two. Have you all voted that care to? Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Ask for a call of the house and I would accept roll call, I mean call-in votes, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a call of the...there's been a request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please check in. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Brown, did you authorize call-ins? Yes, she says.

CLERK: Senator Connealy voting yes. Senator Baker voting no.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I remind you the house is under call. Please return to your seats.
