CLERK: Senator Engel voting yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, Senator Matzke, would you check in. The house is under call. Call-in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes. Senator Bourne voting yes. Senator Kristensen voting yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the second component.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Part two of the Brown amendment has been adopted to the committee amendments. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the third and final component, FA200. (FA200, Legislative Journal pages 1948-1949.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: To open, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the third component, which is actually the first division, on page 1, down to page...down to line 19 on page 2, has to do with the tax-exempt status of the property of the housing agency and how that...how the tax-exempt status must exist for housing authorities to continue to receive federal funding, and how, in the mixed ownership, mixed financing portion, how that is divided, how the tax-exempt part is divided and how...and the attempt in this language was to make it as consistent as possible with LB 271. And I know that there is an amendment that is going to be coming, and I think it would be easier, probably, to have the discussion about this with the amendment that is going to come up. And so, at this point, I will close and allow the amendment to come up, so that we can begin talking with...with the inclusion of the next amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. We are discussing part one of the Brown amendment to the committee amendment.
