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able to live in the subsidized portion. The other up to 60 percent of the project could be available to individuals of higher incomes that do not qualify for subsidization, and under the Smith amendment that amount would be 100 percent of the median, and in counties outside the metropolitan area it could go to...or counties that are smaller counties that could go to 125 percent of the median. So that would allow for...for the margin between the people who could live in the subsidized portion and the people who could live in the unsubsidized portion is fairly small, and the other part that we have to think about is whether, as a moderate income person, we're...you would be willing to live in public housing, pay the full market rate, because you must pay the full market rate, and also submit all of your income, your tax statements and things like that, so that you can be income qualified to be able to do that. The other...the other part that we need to think about in...is what we're really talking about in terms of the impact of public housing in...competitively in the private market. In Lincoln, there are 44,000 units of rental property. Twelve hundred of those units are public housing. Currently, Lincoln public Housing Authority has 65 units that are available to nonqualified, to higher than...than subsidized individuals, and they have a waiting list...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...of 500. The Omaha public Housing Authority has 2,770 units and 800 people on the waiting list. Kearney public Housing Authority has 276 units and 105 on the waiting list. So you can see that fairly substantial waiting list in each case. And so we're not talking about impacting probably very substantially into the private market and, plus, we're going to have to income qualify these individuals. So I oppose this aspect of the Smith amendment and...and also encourage you to vote it down. But I also encourage you in any incarnation that it may come back in the...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR BROWN: ...future to also consider voting it down. Thank you.
