you as much as I think you can afford, or have at your disposal to pay for it. Would you agree?

SENATOR SMITH: Supply and demand, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And has your amendment come down, Senator? Oh, thank you. Then I will just wrap up what I'm going to say. Everybody who is knowledgeable about the sale of property and the rental of property will know that sometimes those in real estate are less reputable than those who sell used cars. But if I get stuck on a used car, it's not going to be a lifetime investment. On property, it can be a different matter. When you are compelled, because of a restricted market, to take less than what your money ought to purchase, less than what you really need and what you desire, then something needs to be done to correct that. This bill does not come anywhere close to correcting it, but it does have a bearing on that issue. I will now do as my colleagues do who are more generous than I am. I'm going to yield some time back to the Chair.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith, you're recognized to close on your amendment. Senator Smith waives closing. Question before us is the adoption of the Smith amendment to the committee amendments to LB 105. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Voting on the Smith amendment. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 0 ayes, 14 nays on the amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk.
