we are consistent with what is required from the federal government in terms of the tax-exempt status, and yet how we can make sure that the portions that are privately held or that are used for purposes other than the provision of services to low-income individuals is taxed. And so, with that, I would support the Hartnett-Wickersham amendment and continue to look at this portion of the bill, especially in light of LB 271. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Discussion on the Wickersham-Hartnett amendment? Senator Hartnett, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, simply clarifies. I think it brings us more in line with what LB 271 and I think would be willing to look at this issue as we move along and on Select File with Senator Brown and Senator Jones. With that, ask for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. The question is the adoption of AM1722 to the committee amendments of LB 105. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wickersham and Hartnett's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: Senator Smith would move to amend. (AM1727, Legislative Journal page 1957.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith, recognized on your motion.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Very briefly, since I think we've already discussed a lot of this, this amendment basically reins in the current unlimited capacity in the committee amendments that would allow a person of any income to live within the confines of a public housing authority. That's...the committee amendments currently do not have any provisions as to the limit of income without receiving a direct subsidy. I'll reiterate the fact that just because
