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median amount. So the resulting project is mixed income, which mixes persons of below median income with other persons of below median income. And the other...the other part that I think is fairly significant is that most mixed income projects are public-private developments, so that the housing authority has...controls the portion that is at least 40 percent of the project that is for eligible, and a private developer might control the 60 percent that is for people above the median or above eligible income. As drafted, this amendment would require that the private sector partner in these mixed income developments would be required to fill their units with persons below 100 percent of the median income, and would be required to verify income on those individuals. This could pose a difficulty for the private developer and, consequently, might pose a difficulty to the housing authority in trying to attract private partners for its development. I'm not certain that there are a lot of private developers who are going to be particularly enthusiastic about income verifying for...for units that they are developing in order to make money. That's to say nothing of what it might do in terms of the ability of a project to attract individuals, because you're already narrowing the pool of available people. You're asking people of higher incomes to live in what is considered a public housing project, paying the full going rate and providing all of their information so that they can be income verified, and...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...and you very well may be asking a private developer to come up with money to develop a project for which he or she has a very limited pool of people that can even live there. So I think that there are a lot of problems with this part, this amendment. I'm not even certain that there's a...that there...that I would be thrilled about it at what...what...with the changes that I think that Senator Jones was trying to get at which would raise the threshold, because I think that there are some operational parts of it that are very problematic and very limiting. But definitely I think that at 100 percent of the median your...your pool...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.
