SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I don't know.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, it is 5:04 a.m. on a day when I have lost my cat. My cat was shot Sunday in Harrison and if I had one more vote my cat might come back to life. Otherwise, I will have to ask for a call of the house and see if we can (laugh)... Mr. President. Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: We're going backwards here. I would ask for...I think it is necessary to ask for a call of the house and I would accept a call-in vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would those members that are not excused please return to the floor. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. We're voting on the motion to suspend the rules. Senator Wickersham has authorized call-in votes. The house is under call.

CLERK: Senator Thompson voting yes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay to suspend the germaneness rule, Mr. President.
