Does that mean that the Secretary of State is going to determine how much each county is to get from the state for these particular items that go on the ballot? Is that what's being referred to, if you know?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator, I think you should ask Senator Robak that, and I'd have to go back and look at the exact language of her amendment. I'm not sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so you...you hadn't said that, Sen...oh.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Robak, would you yield to the same...to answer the same question, please?

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. When it was said that the Secretary of State's Office will smooth all of these things out, was that suggesting that the Secretary of State is going to determine how much each county spent to put these items on the ballot?

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, that was the idea, and I would suggest everybody throw that handout away because it doesn't seem to be very accurate at this point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Who put the handout together, do you know?

SENATOR ROBAK: I believe NACO did, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they support this bill.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, but I mean now, dad, does this mean I can't go to medical school now? (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah, daughter, that has nothing to do with this. That's written in concrete. I'm not going to take away that because that's my future security.
