SENATOR TYSON: No, the Robak amendment will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, the Robak amendment will give the counties relief. Would Rolands do just as well, in your opinion? Thank you. It takes him awhile to digest that. That's all that I have.

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Robak, you're recognized to close on AM1537 to LB 571.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay. Is he calling on me now?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Robak, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, Mr. President, thank you very much. We did have some good debate on this and I do have a lot of supporters here. I do think we have some very, very incorrect information and, Senator Schimek, I would like to get more information on this, a better estimate. This fiscal estimate has to be wrong because it's based on two constitutional amendments in each primary and five in each general election, so I don't...you know, we just can't take an estimate like that. And then they go on to say the costs per estimate...per petition is estimated at \$76,000. So I would like to get more facts, more accurate information from the counties, if it's possible, and with that, Mr. President, I would withdraw this amendment and do another one on Select File. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.
