to...how to deal with minors. I also want this summer to go on some of the compliance checks and check out and see exactly what happens when these people go in and to try to procure alcohol. I believe that we need to work on this. I think that there needs to be some leniency when a compliance check is done. But for that part, if the amendment stays in its present form, as I said before, I will support it because I gave my word to Senator Landis and those people working on the bill that I would do so. I know...I don't like it but I will still support it. I believe we are...we've given and taken, both sides gave some...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...and I think that we can live with this. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President and members of the body, I just want to stand up and talk a little bit about this. We've had issues like this in Judiciary and Transportation and everybody says, well, if you don't put no penalty on the youth, you know, we're not going to support it, and I've heard people say that we really need to do that, if we're going to go ahead with it. Well, we do have penalties on the youth, and I just want to read what I...in the statutes here. If you want to look it up, it's 53-180-4, point 4. It says, warnings to persons under 21: You are subject to penalty up to \$500 fine, three months in jail, or both, if you're twenty...under 21, and you purchase or attempt to purchase or have in your possession alcoholic liquor and the...in establishment. And it also says, and warnings to adults: You are subject to penalty up to \$1,000 fine, one year in jail, or both if you are under...over...if you are 21 and over and you purchase the alcoholic beverage for a person under 21. So that's in our statutes and I think we should think about that. Anybody that says that this here should have more penalty on the youth, we already have it in statutes right now. And Senator Landis alluded to something here that did happen to me in the Rotunda, that one lobbyist came up to me and says, on the first offense they're going to shut down this establishment. Now, that's not right if he would have read the bill because I think that's just a blatant lie, really, because he should have
