SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'll tell you what, if you're 19, 20-years-old, and you spend three months in the clink, I don't think you're going to go try to procure alcohol again, but I don't...I have...I would like to see the facts and figures on how many young people have actually ended up paying that...paying that price for trying to procure alcohol or trying to elude or trying to fool, altered driver's license, whatever it might be. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Engel, followed by Senator Landis and Senator Brashear. Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you, Madam Chairman, members of the body. I, too, believe that we should put more responsibility on the youth themselves. Senator Jones has brought out there is a law on the books. There is a fine of \$500, et cetera, et cetera, for any minor attempting to purchase alcohol. The thing is I've never heard of anyone who has ever been prosecuted under that...under that law. I believe we should come up with something as a deterrent to these teenagers who are buying alcohol. Again, we talked before about taking away their driver's license. Well, I don't think, again, as before, I don't think that's the answer because it's not a driving violation, but we have to come up with something to make them more responsible because many of these teenagers, when they come into these establishments, some of them look like they're probably 25-years-old. And, again, like Senator Brashear has mentioned, that trying to keep full employment in the state of Nebraska, you're hiring many, many people off the streets that are good people but they are not math wizards. I...that, I had an experience with that in a fast food restaurant not very long ago in my hometown. I gave him a ten dollar bill for my sandwich. The cash register opened but it did not tell him much change I get. I tried to help this young clerk with that. I know he graduated from high school and, of course, he couldn't accept my help but I understand that. He had to get his manager
