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to help him make change. So in other words, so many things are so automated anymore that they do not have to use their mind, and I can see why they do get confused on when you're born, whether you're 21-years-old or not. I do believe that these flagrant violators who are intentionally selling liquor to these minors, they should be prosecuted. I have no problem with that at all. But another thing, I do...another thing, we should put more emphasis on the Department of Motor Vehicles, when we come out with this magnetic strip on the driver's license. As that...as that is phased in, I think you alleviate this problem because then you just run it through your machine and you know whether they're old enough to buy liquor. Another, but again, it will take time to phase that in, another penalty for these teenagers would be if they are altering their driver's license in order to buy liquor, which many of them do, and they do get caught with the altered driver's license, then I think that license, there is one case where we should revoke or suspend their driver's license because they're using it for reasons other than driving. Senator Brashear's amendment that he might propose, I think that would be a good amendment. I think that would be a fair amendment to the liquor...to the retailers and I think it would serve our propose and give us time to work on...the Department of Motor Vehicles to get the magnetic strips on the driver's license. I yield the rest of my time.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Engel. Senator Landis.
