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These are all then subject to the discretionary authority of the Liquor Control Commission, in which I am expressing no lack of confidence whatsoever. They are instituted and established by law and function under the law, but by the same token, I can understand a licensed retailer, in all other respects, endeavoring to operate their business correctly, being concerned about being subject to this kind of what could be a substantial economic sanction the very second time they make a mistake, or any of their agents or designees or employees make a mistake. That's my sole motive in offering it. I may turn on my light but I do not intend to talk three times. This is simply to test the water and see where the members of the body are and not otherwise delay the proceedings. I thank you for your consideration. I urge the adoption of AM1752.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Brashear. On the Brashear amendment, discussion, Senator Landis, followed by Chambers, Baker, Janssen and Brashear. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. I looked at the amendment and, Senator Brashear, I'll need just one bit of clarification. Third offense, three years, I couldn't tell which of the two penalties was accessed, 24 hours or 15 days. Can you tell me?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Brashear, will you yield.

SENATOR LANDIS: I just checked, I couldn't answer myself, I didn't know.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: My understanding...

SENATOR LANDIS: Second offense, 48 hours.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...is the 48 hours.

SENATOR LANDIS: Okay. Brashear amendment says...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Landis, you need to speak into the mike.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...48-hours on the third offense in three
