SENATOR JONES: Yes, I probably will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. My time is up.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Madam Chair, members of the body, I will expedite this, too. I supported the Landis amendment because there are a number of good things in there, and that was part of the rationale we had the other evening when we worked on the thing. There's...nobody was real happy, and also one of the reasons I supported it was knowing full well that Senator Hilgert and Senator Brashear had amendments and I will support those. So that's...I'm urging people to take Senator Brashear's amendment seriously. I certainly do. As I said, I supported the Landis amendment because I knew this was a potential amendment coming up. So Lan...Senator Landis does make a good point. The clerks are liable. That's part of the reason we have such a turnover. There's umpteen different rules and regulations as far as selling alcoholic beverages on credit and so on. We've had problems with it, I know the retail industry does, and it's tough to keep these clerks because as he pointed out, and I should have, clerks are liable personally for a lot of the responsibility they take there when they go to work. So with that, I will return the rest of my cha...my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Janssen, followed by Chambers, Brashear, and Hilgert. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Madam President, and members. Most of the time we talk about, when we talk about the minor that is fined or caught for doing this, I don't see them, you know, I would like to see the facts on how...how long they go to jail, and how much of a fine they pay. I bet it isn't very much. This is at the discretion, the discretion of the Liquor Commission. They hold the keys to this and I have the utmost respect for them. They're doing a fine job. They look at each case on its own merits. It was very evident here a few weeks ago when they threw out, I think there were 15 violations that had occurred in the compliance checks and they threw them out.
